Laura Jane hails from just outside of Detroit, Michigan where she was adopted into a multicultural family. Her first professional gig was singing in the children's chorus of the Opera Grand Rapids in performances of *Carmen* and *Tosca*. She grew up doing theatre, studying dance, playing piano, writing poetry and short stories. Laura Jane also sang on radio and television commercials as a kid including one for the megastore MEIJER'S. She went on to study musical theatre at the Boston Conservatory of Music and then transferred to the University of the Arts in Philadelphia graduating with a BFA in theatre arts and music.

Laura Jane's theatrical credits include "Twist" (Walnut Street Theatre, Philadelphia), "Bobos", a hip hop musical (American Music Theatre Festival, Philadelphia) "Little Shop of Horrors", "Beehive" (Gem Theatre, Detroit) "Jesus Christ Superstar" (Santa Barbara Civic Light Opera) "Slam" (San Diego Repertory Theatre), a national tour of "Harlem Renaissance" for Black history month, and a European tour of the rock musical "HAIR". She was also a stand in for the role of *Liu* in the opera "Turandot" (Houston Grand Opera). Lastly, Laura Jane recorded vocals for the "Chase Brock Experience" (Brooklyn, New York).

Laura Jane's film and television credits include; singing lead in Italian doing a remake of *Quando Quando Quando* with Chris Mann on the "Letters to Juliet" soundtrack, "Sex and the City 2", she was the voice of Eva Longoria (who played Dora's mom) on "Dora and the Lost City of Gold", "Bad Boys for Life", "The Get Down" (Netflix), "Let it Shine" (Disney), "We Will Rise" (ABC), "The Neighbors" (NBC), "Pose" (FX), "Wu-Tang: An American Saga" (HULU), "Death in Paradise" (BBC), an episode for "Little America" (Apple TV) starring Phylicia Rashad, and "Six Thirty" on (Apple TV).

She also sang behind Cynthia Erivo for the 2020 Academy Awards and Sofia Carson and Diane Warren for the 2023 Academy Awards. Laura Jane has appeared on almost

every single music related show on Univision and Telemundo, numerous television shows through out Europe, including BBC, in France, Germany and was a apart of the launch of MTV India.

Laura Jane is a vocal coach and mentor to many artists all over the world. She has co-produced and vocal produced many projects such as upcoming star *Aisha* (Katara Studios - Qatar) who was a featured artist on "Hayya Hayya" - the original single for the FIFA WORLD CUP 2022, Brazilian Jazz Artist, *Luciana* (from Sao Paolo), and Tejano Artist *Devin Banda* - placing her song on the television show "Rosewell" in 2021 - "UN POQUITO MAS" in which Laura Jane was a co-writer and executive producer. "UN POQUITO MAS" was produced by latin grammy winners *Manual Papayo and Leonardo Brooks*.

Laura Jane has independently run her own company - "The Laura Jane International Vocal Studio". Specializing in custom vocal coaching, producing, arranging, contracting of musicians, producers and creating PR teams for clients. She has vocal coached at Musicians Institute (Los Angeles), Los Angeles Music Academy, School of rock (Los Angeles) Musicians' Woodshed (Austin, Texas), Orange County Hit Factory Academy (Los Angeles) Future Stars of Houston, Diaz Music Institute (Houston) and Humphrey School of Musical Theatre (Houston)

Laura Jane is a co-producer of the "King Cole Legacy Experience" - a tribute to *Nat King Cole and Natalie Cole* which premiered at the Ensemble Theatre in Houston. It received a feature in the the International *Musician Magazine* for hiring a 22 piece orchestra by the local AFM-65-699.

Laura Jane is also a playwright and wrote a one woman show on *Angela Davis* and is actively seeking funding to produce an initial staged reading of it.

Laura Jane is a singer songwriter and has released three independent albums on her own: *To My Planet Boo* in 2005, *Everything Changes* in 2012 and *Weep Willow* in 2021. She has performed her own shows in New York, Los Angeles, London, Kyoto, Prague, Budapest and Monaco.
